

FREDDIE JARDINE (fullback)-Another Scot, from Edinburgh, he played for Dundee before coming south to Luton in 1961.


JOHN MOORE (wing half)-His third season at Luton, being a regular member of our first team. Previously played for Motherwell, Was born at Hart Hill (Scotland).
